

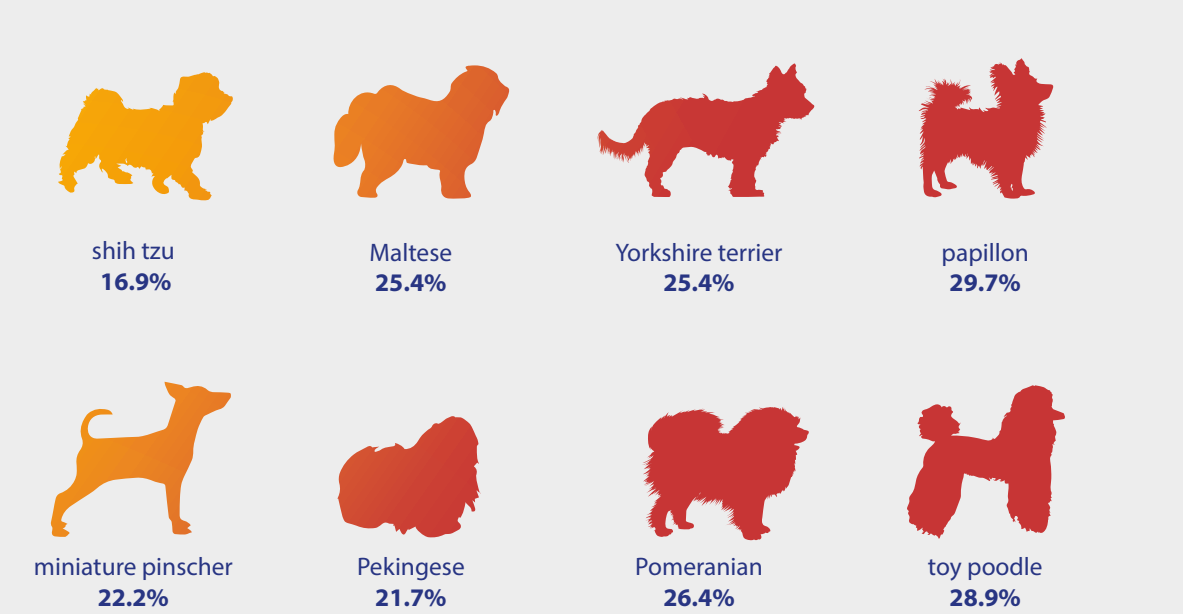
How at risk is your dog?

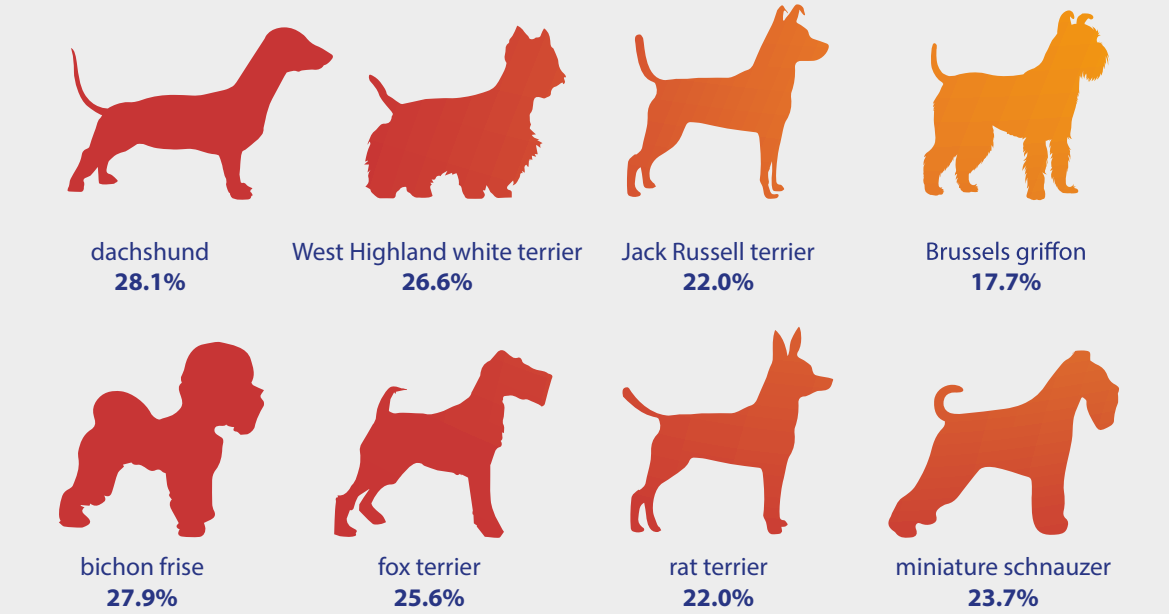

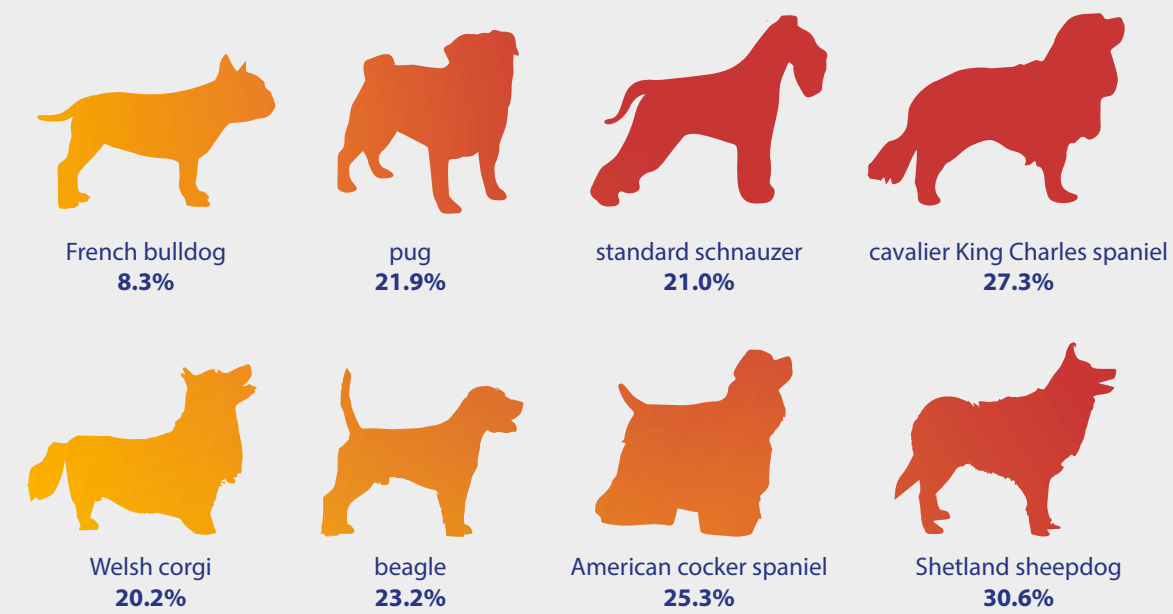
EXTRA-SMALL (<6.5kg)



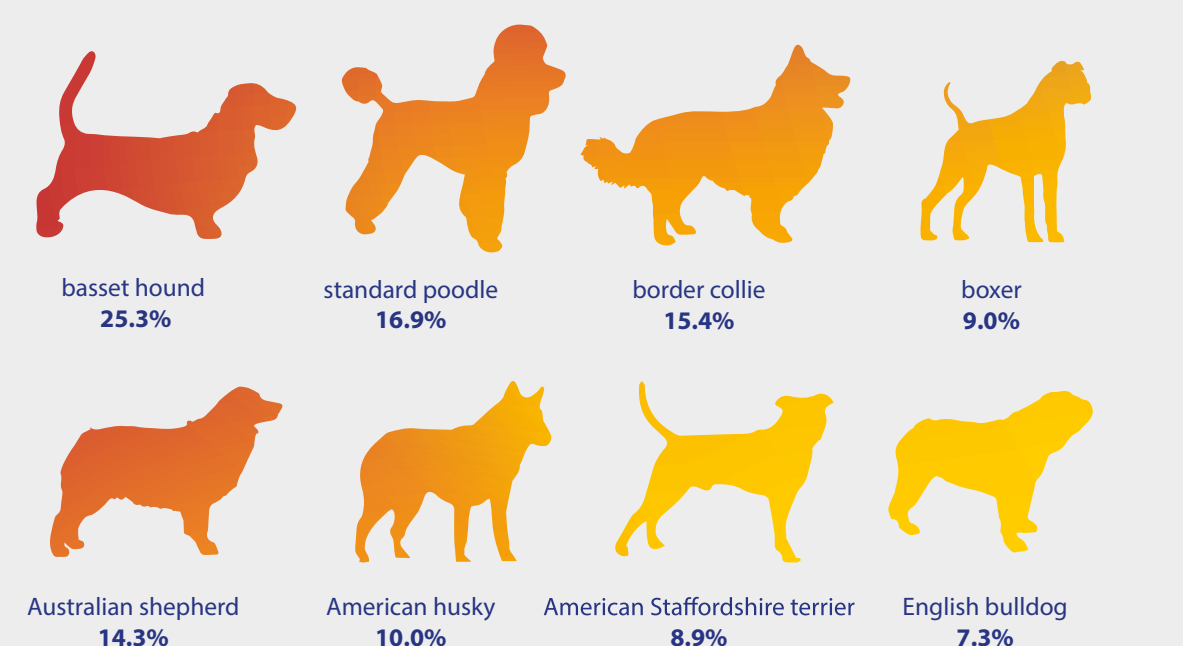
SMALL (6.5–9kg)



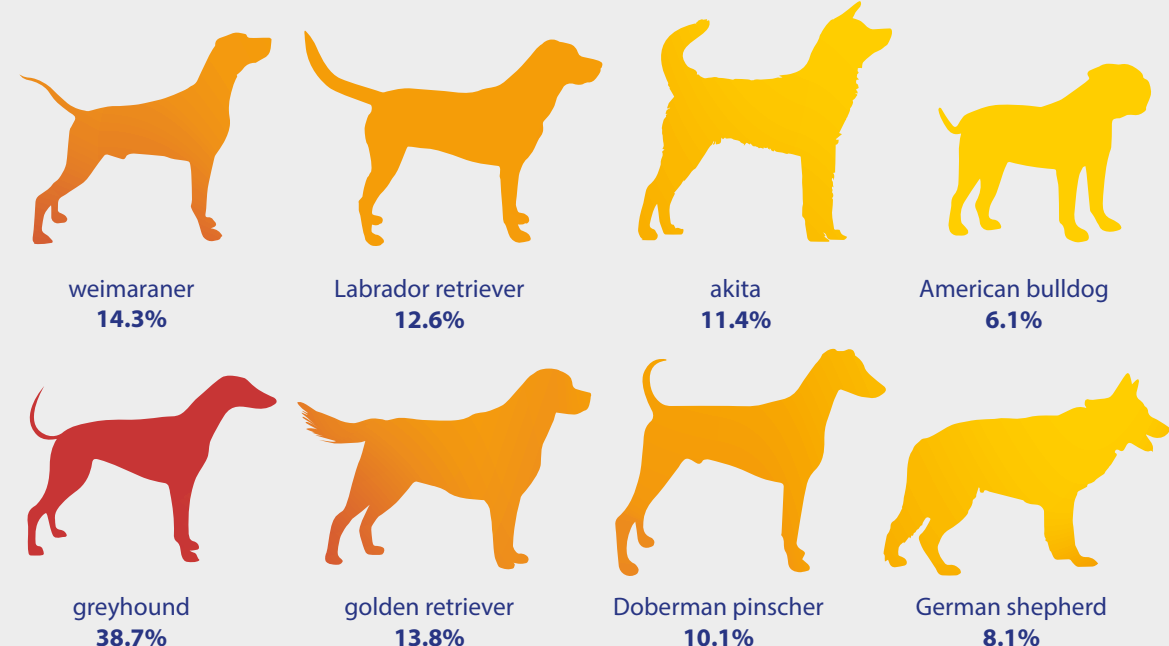
MEDIUM-SMALL (9–15kg)



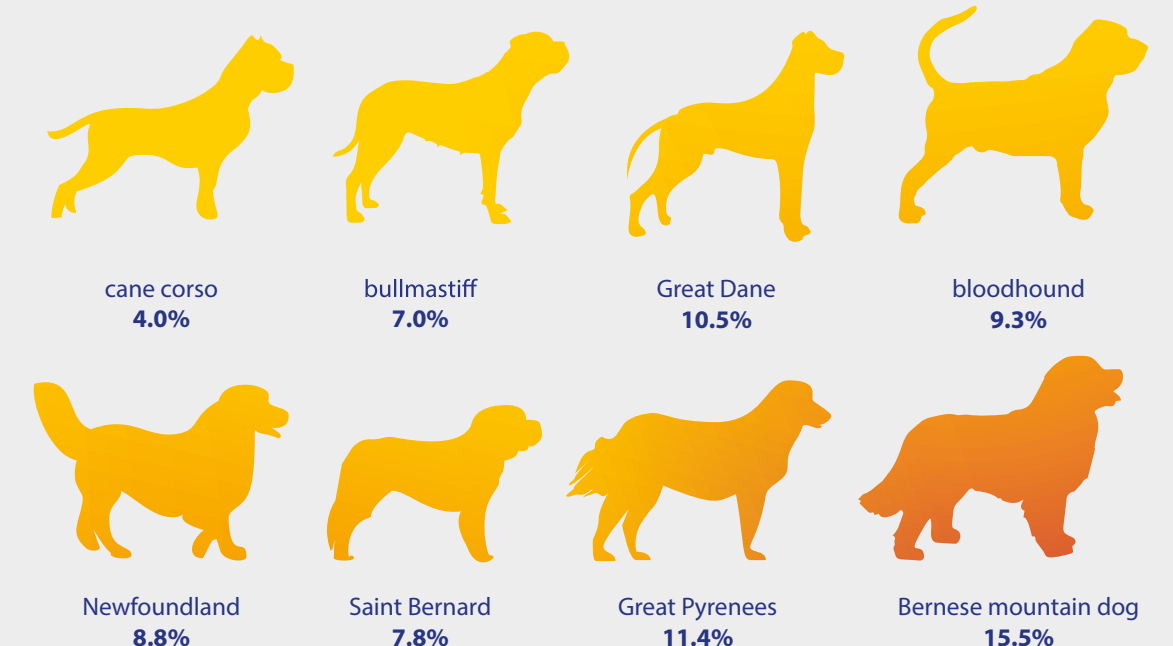
MEDIUM-LARGE (15–30kg)
